




# International Day of the Girl – 11 October

Dec. 8: On Tuesday, June 28, 2022, the jury recommendations from the Renfrew Ontario Inquest into the deaths of Carol Culleton, Anastasia Kuzyk and Nathalie Warmerdam were presented. In total, 86 recommendations for change were made, speaking to oversight and accountability, funding, education and training, measures addressing perpetrators of intimate partner violence, intervention and safety. 
# Zonta Says NO Summit Tuesday 10 December


As a community it's important to stand together against all forms of violence and abuse. I want to thank all those who work in the sector who come to the aid of women and children during times of crisis and distress.


# **Club Twinning Programme**

Two weeks ago, I received the following message from Raisa Valva, Twinning Programme Coordinator and member of the Zonta Club of Lahti, Finland:

It gives us great pleasure, on behalf of President Salla, to announce that your two clubs **Kanata-Stittsville from Canada and Taranto from Italy** have been matched for the initial Zonta International *Twinning Program*.

We hope you are as excited as we are. This matching is the first step.... now it's up to you!

As you would expect, the *Twinning* Program is all about developing connections, friendships and relationships across the Zonta world. It is about supporting each other and creating opportunities for sharing ideas. We now encourage you to make contact with each other over the coming days to set up an initial meeting. At this meeting, we suggest you provide each other with as much background about your club as possible. You could also agree how you will work (frequency of meetings, best communication methods, etc.), and discuss ideas about how your two clubs can benefit from this experience.





We also wanted to let you know about our Kick-off Celebration which will be held in January via Zoom. All twinned clubs will be invited to attend. More details on this celebration will be provided in the coming weeks.

# 13th December Meeting

I emailed Media Relations at Ottawa Police Services to inquire about asking someone from the Intimate Partner Violence Unit to speak at our next club meeting on Friday 13 December. It would be an excellent way to wrap up the 16 Days of Activism Campaign that ends on 10 December. Melanie Winwood, Senior Advisor-Violence Against Women, Ottawa Police Services, replied and has kindly agreed to attend our meeting on 13 December in person to talk to the club. She also had a few questions to which I replied:

- 20-minute talk followed by Q&A
- meeting to take place in Stittsville from 6:00-7:00 p.m.
- facts and statistics for the Ottawa region
- · update on the use and definition of the term « femicide »
- recent murders and domestic violence
- statistics on femicides and calls that OPS answers related to domestic violence
- if possible, breakdown of different kinds of abuse such as physical, financial, etc.
- breakdown by demographics, i.e., ethnicity, First Nations, 2SLGBTQI+, urban, rural, etc.

If these statistics are unavailable for Ottawa, is there a reason for either not collecting them or not conducting a fine-grained analysis?

We are asking GRANs, OCW, OCTEVAW and ZCO if members would be interested in attending. The meeting will be in person in Stittsville and virtual.
