UN Committee Eileen Gilligan

Hi Everyone! I'm happy to write to you as the new chair of the UN Committee of District 2. In order to keep us all together in our efforts for the UN, I plan to email all the UN Chairs from the Zonta clubs in our District – but who are they? I have a list from last year, but it may have changed. So, please, could club presidents email me and tell me who the UN Chair is from your club.

I hope to contact each club to learn what UN-related or climate-related projects are planned or even happening. Many of you are doing great things to further the mission of Zonta and our UN partners, and we'd all love to hear about your work. And I have some ideas for easy projects that we could all do together. I'll keep you posted on this concept.

Climate Idea

As you can read below, one of our roles at the UN is as observers in the UN Environment Program. So, as individuals and clubs, we should take steps to address climate change. An obvious suggestion from the World Wildlife Fund is so easy I have to include it here: "PUT ON A SWEATER. Remember when you turn up the heat in wintertime, your furnace is probably burning fossil fuel. A sweater or nice warm robe will keep you even warmer and will help conserve resources and reduce climate change."

This may actually be a very "high class" thing to do. I noticed in video interviews with Lady Canarvan from Highclere (i. e. Downtown Abbey) that she and other castle inhabitants dress in sweaters and robes indoors, presumably because the castle is drafty even in nice weather. So bundle up and help reduce greenhouse gasses.

Our Many UN Roles

(To all existing members, this will be a review. To all new members, this is an introduction to the relationship between the United Nations (UN) and Zonta International (ZI)) Zonta International has been involved with the United Nations since the UN was founded after WWII. In the parlance of the UN, ZI is an accredited non-governmental organization (NGO) and, as such, is welcome to serve in an observer role or consultative role in meetings and discussions with some sections of the UN and with other accredited NGOs.

CSW: More specifically, ZI has consultative status with the Commission on the Status of Women (part of the Economic and Social Counsel) which closely works with UN Women (part of the General Assembly). Our accreditation allows us to present written statements to the General Assembly and to participate in the preparation of joint statements from the large group of NGOs, the group officially called NGO CSW. This group has offices around the world; the closest one to us is in NYC and is led by Zontian Pam Morgan (who is also the ZI UN Committee chair). It is the NGO CSW-NY office that hosts meetings during the CSW conferences every March. Hopefully several District 2 members will be able to attend this coming year.

UNEP: In 2023, ZI received observer status with the UN Environment Program. This part of the General Assembly is focused on 3 related topics: climate change, plastic pollution, and biodiversity loss. As we all understand, problems that adversely effect the environment make life especially difficult for women and other globally disadvantaged groups (the "climate justice" perspective). So, the Zonta Says NOW campaign is a local-to-global effort to help address climate issues and bring awareness to the gender connection. UNICEF and UNFPA: ZI financially supports projects of these 2 programs, the United Nations Children's Fund and the United Nations Population Fund (parts of the General Assembly). This biennium, we will provide \$4,000,000 to these organizations for projects to educate and protect girls and women from gender-based violence and climate-induced family and community instability. If you haven't already checked it out, go to www.laaha.org for a look at one of the UN projects that we fund. It is an safe and educational website for girls around the world.

Application Period Opens for Amelia Earhart Fellowships

Outreach to women enrolled in doctoral programs focused on aerospace engineering or space sciences throughout District 2 has begun to encourage their application for the Amelia Earhart Fellowships.

Marketing materials about the Amelia Earhart Fellowships have been shared with eight doctoral-granting institutions throughout the district. Personal outreach to program directors and administrators has ensured the Fellowship materials have been shared with eligible students. A reminder of the deadline will be shared in early November to encourage eligible students to submit their materials by the Nov. 15 deadline.

Zonta International Amelia Earhart Fellowships were established in 1938 in honor of Amelia Earhart, famed pilot and Zonta club member. The Amelia Earhart Fellowships are awarded annually to women pursuing a Ph.D./doctoral degree conducting research applied to aerospace engineering or space sciences. The Fellowship of \$10,000 may be used at any university or college offering accredited post-graduate courses and degrees.

Please encourage anyone you know who meets the criteria to apply. All application materials are due by **Nov. 15, 2024**, to be considered for the 2025 Fellowships, and can be completed online at: https://zontainternational.awardspring.com.








We kicked off our year with a club retreat where we enjoyed getting to know one another, yoga and mindful breathing, and time to work on our new projects.


